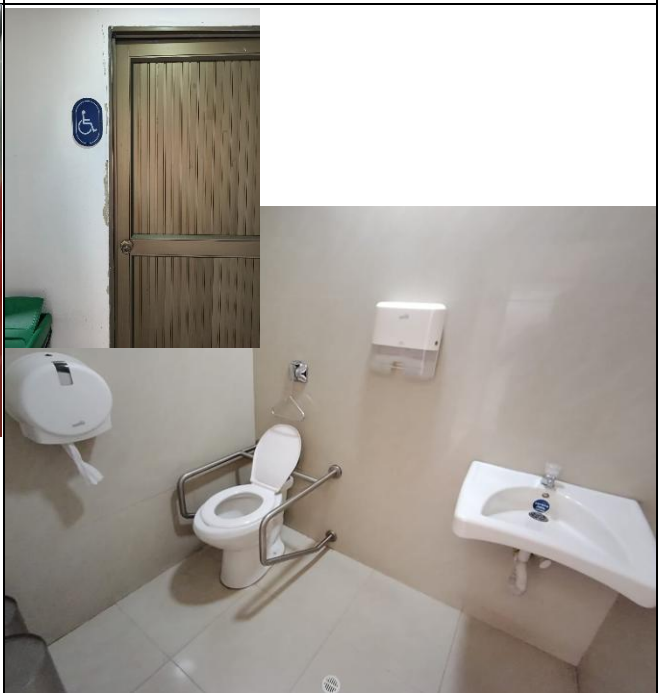

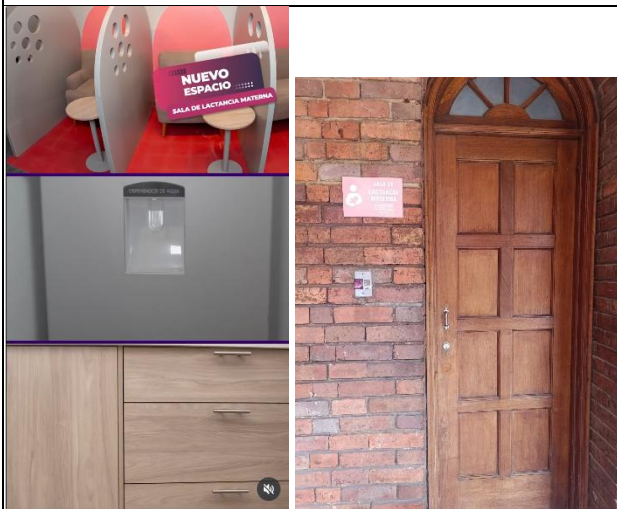

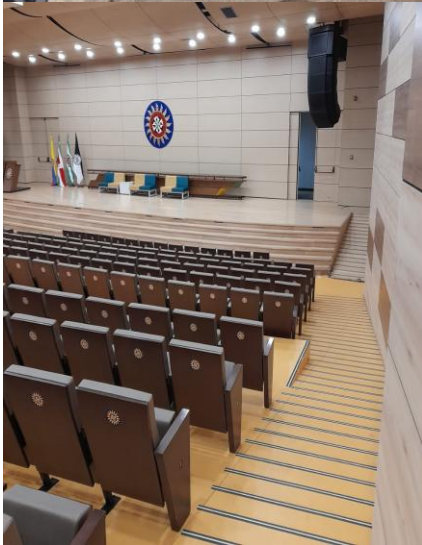
The Santo Tomas University buildings located in the city of Bogota have access ramps, elevators and restrooms adequate to meet the needs of the entire population.

1. In the bathroom batteries of all buildings there are adequate and comfortable spaces.
2. For the use of elevators, people with reduced mobility are prevalent in spaces such as auditoriums where they have preferential locations.
3. There is parking spaces enabled for people with reduced mobility, access ramps to the interior of the buildings and in the external areas.
4. The signage of the academic spaces includes sign language and Braille.

In each of the academic and administrative spaces we have signage in Braille, formalizing inclusion alternatives at the Tunja section level; On the other hand, we highlight that our Santoro Tunja legal office is recognized for being Inclusive, both for LGTBIQ people, women and people with disabilities.

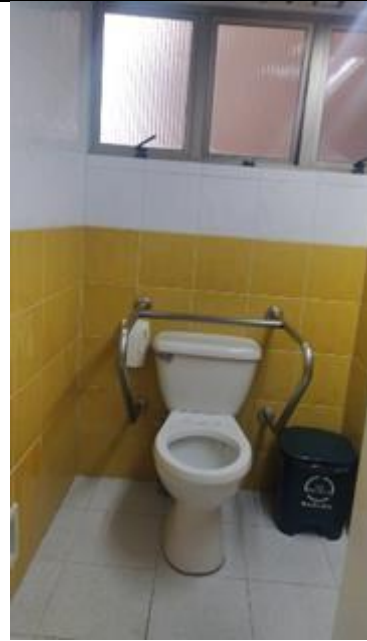

At the Bucaramanga Sectional Campuses, there are spaces for wheelchair movement, bathrooms equipped with safety bars for people in wheelchairs, elevators, ramps, and medical and nursing care areas. The Bucaramanga Campus features signage for people with visual and hearing disabilities. Additionally, the Floridablanca and Piedrecuesta Campuses include tactile signage to support visually impaired individuals.

Nursing Family Friendly Rooms have been installed at the Bucaramanga and Floridablanca Campuses, providing dedicated spaces for lactation. Last year, a modern elevator was installed in the Fray Angélico building at the Floridablanca Campus, greatly facilitating access to the facilities for people with reduced mobility.

Lactation Room

1. Bathrooms for the exclusive use of people with reduced mobility.
2. Elevators have priority for people with disabilities, pregnant women and older adults.
3. Both the Aguas Claras and Loma Linda campuses, as well as the admissions offices and the legal office, have access ramps with non-slip tapes for people with reduced mobility.
4. Finally, there are signs to identify spaces or services intended for people with disabilities, reduced mobility or pregnant women. In the classrooms, signs for each room are posted in Braille.
5. Construction and commissioning of the lactation room for mothers in the Tomasina community and visitors.

The Valledupar CAU has an access ramp for people with disabilities at the main entrance, as well as bathrooms adapted for their use. At the CAU of Neiva, the main entrance has a ramp for the disabled, handrails and stairs. The Duitama CAU is in the project phase for the installation of a universal use bathroom and other accessible adaptations. The CAU of Barranquilla offers various spaces adapted for people with disabilities, including access ramps. In the CAU of Armenia, there is a ramp for the disabled at the main entrance and adapted bathrooms
